

**She Votes: Women's Voices at the Forefront** 









#### Methodology


- Benenson Strategy Group conducted 811 online interviews nationwide from February 3 8, 2023 among women who are registered voters, including an oversample of younger women 18-25 years old.
- The margin of error for the dataset overall is +/- 3.4% at the 95% confidence level and is higher among subgroups.
- Due to rounding, some percentages may not add up to 100%.







#### 5 Key Takeaways



- Women are feeling even more burned out than ever this year particularly Black women and moms of young children. Younger women are feeling burned out and struggling financially more than other groups, with 1 in 3 not making ends meet month to month.
- Looking ahead to 2024, women are feeling more engaged in politics and about 1 in 3 talk to their friends and family about politics weekly. Women want to get involved in local, state or federal level politics, though just 1 in 3 have actually been able to become involved. Young women are looking to elect more women leaders, with over half saying it's important for the 2024 candidate to be a woman and most believe women can push through gridlock to get things done in Congress.
- In light of the Dobbs decision last summer, women are highly concerned about reproductive rights, and tuned into the conversation around making abortion and other healthcare services more accessible and affordable to anyone in need.
- With increasing partisanship around every corner, a plurality of women are concerned about extremism on both sides of the ideological spectrum. There is also deep skepticism among Republican women in particular of our regulatory institutions and our election system, with nearly half of Republican women (and 1 in 4 overall) saying they don't trust the results of national elections.









What word or phrase would you use to describe life in America today?












# Pocketbook issues retain a large influence on vote choice – but we've seen significant increases in abortion, guns, healthcare and crime in the past couple years

Most important issues when deciding whom to vote for









% Pessimistic about the economy










## And women are feeling anxious and frustrated about it – only 1 in 5 women self describe as hopeful

#### Which TWO of the following best describe your feelings about how things are going in the US right now?










# Women, especially those with young children and Black women, are feeling significantly more burned out than they were just a year ago

#### Would you say you have felt burned out...








# Personal financial situations continue to worsen for women, with more than half saying their situation has gotten worse










#### **Women in Leadership**

#### Local entities like schools and police departments are seen favorably within communities, more partisan figures and institutions are majority unfavorable













#### Electing more women to office is almost universally important








## While Democrats see room for progress with more women in Congress, Independents and Republicans are less likely to see a path










## Independents and voters over 40 have become more disengaged in the past few years, while younger voters and parents of young kids are starting to catch up






#### The plurality of women who don't talk politics frequently cite lack of interest but 1 in 3 say it's too confrontational




Do you think these conversations have made you more or less motivated to get involved in politics, either at a local, state, or federal level?

- I don't feel like I know enough to get involved in local issues or politics














#### **Reproductive Rights**

### When it comes to reproductive rights, the vast majority believe abortion should be available and/or the government should be kept out of decisions












## And though the majority of demographics think abortion should be legal at least in most cases, nearly a third believe there should be some restrictions










#### Democrats, Latinas and younger voters want to push lawmakers to expand abortion








#### More than 3 in 4 women have heard at least something about last year's Supreme Court decision

#### Dobbs impact






## More than a third – including nearly half of Dem, younger, and suburban women – say that politicians have made accessing repro care more difficult since the decision


Since the Supreme Court overturned Roe v. Wade, which of the following comes closer to your experience?



How much do you trust the information and decisions coming from each of the following?










#### Nearly 1 in 4 women – driven by almost half of Republican women – don't trust the results of our local or national elections










## Fear that both parties are dominated by extremists is prevalent especially among younger women and Independents










#### Women leaders are seen as far more trustworthy on most policy priorities, especially when it comes to abortion and childcare
